### Meet me in St. Loo-eel

On behalf of the 2024 National Specialty Planning Committee, I invite you all to meet us in the city with a grand history of celebrating our theme of *Bringing Friends Together*. In 1904, St. Louis hosted the first World's Fair, which brought 50 foreign nations plus 43 of the 45 then states in the US together for this festive event. The focus of the World's Fair was to spotlight new technology with the debut of "wireless telephony", the mother of the modern telephone, and the "telautograph", the ancestor of the fax machine. One of the most popular attractions of this Worlds Fair was contained in the Palace of Transportation—private automobiles and motor cars. The automobile display contained 140 models, including ones powered by gasoline, steam, and electricity. Phones, faxes, and automobiles. . . friends could not come together without these.

In addition, St. Louis is known for the Gateway Arch, which was completed in 1965. The Arch was built as a monument to the westward expansion of the United States and officially dedicated to "the American people". The Arch is considered the "Gateway to the West" and symbolizes bringing people together from east to west and north to south. Purina Farms, our show venue 38 miles southwest of St. Louis proper, is known as the premier dog show site in the United States. Dog show friends and their pets convene here every year for more than a dozen national specialties, multiple regional specialties and all-breed shows, and numerous agility and herding trials, along with FastCAT, Go-To-Ground, and Dock Diving events. There's no better place to bring humans and their canines together.

We look forward to you joining us to celebrate our dogs and the friends we have made because of them.

# ACCOMMODATIONS

#### **HOST HOTELS**

This year we are offering two great host hotels to accommodate our attendees.

Holiday Inn St Louis West at Six Flags, 4901 Six Flags Rd, Eureka MO 63025, Phone (636) 938-6661

The Holiday Inn will be the site for the Health Auction and the Judges Banquet. It is a 10—15-minute drive the show site at Purina Farms. There are expansive grounds for dog walking and even a dog bathing station.

Breakfast is not included in the room rate. There is a full service restaurant on site.

The Holiday Inn Group Fee, a one-time, non-refundable fee of \$35, will be charged to EVERYONE, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THEY HAVE DOGS OR NOT. There is a limit of 4 dogs per room; plastic will be provided to put under crates. All dogs are required to be crated while unattended in room.

Guests may call (800) 782-8108 or (636) 938-6661 to make a reservation until the block is full. Let the agent know that you are with the Bernese Mountain Dog Club. The last date to make a reservation at the Bernese Mountain Dog Club rate is February 27, 2024.

The Wildwood Hotel, 2801 Fountain Place, Wildwood MO 63040, Phone (636) 733-9100

The Wildwood Hotel is a more upscale hotel. It also has a large grassy area for walking dogs. No evening events are being held at the Wildwood. It is located closer to St Louis, but is still only a 20-minute drive to Purina Farms. A self-serve breakfast is included in the room rate. There is a one-time, non-refundable fee of \$50 for 1-2 dogs, or \$75 for 3-4 dogs; plastic will be provided to put under crates. All dogs are required to be crated while unattended in room.

## Parking

Exhibitor and visitor parking will be located on blacktop parking lots in front of the Purina Event Center. Vehicles are limited to one parking space. No exercise pens or crates are allowed on the blacktop surface, but they are allowed on grass areas. No cones are allowed in parking areas. No parking is allowed in roadways or next to building.

# **RV Parking**

RV parking spots are available through the Purina Farms RV Park, which is conveniently located adjacent to the show building and show site featuring two areas: 1) the main lot has full hookup, with 30-amp/50-amp electrical service and sewer at each site; or 2) the show field lot, with electric only. Due to the possibility of freezing, water will not be available at each site, but is available to fill your RV when you arrive, and water refill service is available mid-week through the BMDCA store. If you wish to rent an RV, there are several companies familiar with working with Purina Farms.

# Travel Information

**Directions to Purina Farms from Holiday Inn St Louis West:** Purina Farms is located just 10 minutes west of the Holiday Inn. Take Highway 44 to the Gray Summit Exit #253 and head north on Highway 100 for 0.5 miles. Take a left and head west on MO-MM for approximately one mile until you reach the Purina Farms entrance on the left.

**Directions to Purina Farms from The Wildwood Hotel:** Purina Farms is located approximately 15 minutes from The Wildwood Hotel. Turn left onto MO-100 W/Old Rte 66 W. After 10 miles, turn right onto MO-MM and travel about one mile until you reach the Purina Farms entrance on the left.

If you plan to travel by plane, the most accessible airport to Gray Summit is St Louis Lambert International Airport. **Directions to Purina Farms from St Louis Lambert International Airport:** Go west on Departing Flights toward Natural Bridge Rd. Turn left onto Natural Bridge Rd. Merge onto I-70 West. Merge onto I-270 South via Exit 232 toward Memphis. Merge onto I-44 West/US 50 via Exit 5B toward Tulsa. Go approximately 23 miles. Take the MO-100 Exit toward Gray Summit. Turn right onto MO-100. Go approximately 0.4 miles to MO-MM. Turn left. Go 1.1 miles to the Purina Farms entrance on the left. Estimated travel time from the airport is 40-45 minutes.

Offered for purebred BMDs. Blood samples will be drawn at the clinic. You can also hand deliver your blood samples from dogs at home, direct to the clinic. Mailed samples can not be accepted. Samples delivered to the clinic should be kept cool (not frozen) in transit to the Specialty. Samples from this clinic will be shipped to Antagene at BMDCA expense.

The Antagene test for Histiocytic Sarcoma gives results expressed as a genetic index, which is based on the statistical analysis of nine genetic markers identified from the scientific research on the Bernese Mountain Dog. It is a **selection tool** and **does not constitute a predictive test for the development of this cancer**. It is a genetic tool to assist breeders in the management of their kennels and decisions on matings, using the Histiocytic Sarcoma Index Mate Selection tool (HSIMS), to enable them to reduce the incidence of Histiocytic Sarcoma in the population of Bernese Mountain Dogs. The **test is not an endpoint but a continuation of the research on Histiocytic Sarcoma. The test will be optimized and refined with advanced research. For this, your participation is essential.** 

Dogs participating in this clinic will be marked as "tested" in the Berner-Garde database, but the index score will not be included.

NOTE: By participating in this clinic, you acknowledge that DNA extracted from your dog's sample may be used for genetic research.

Dr. Heidi Kellihan, DVM, DACVIM-Cardiology will be available to perform cardiac evaluations using auscultation (a non-invasive procedure) or echocardiogram. OFA requires that dogs be at least one year of age when examined to receive cardiac clearance and our clinician recommends that echocardiograms be conducted. Registrants will be contacted for scheduling.

#### Reminders

- Please be on time for your appointment(s) and remember to bring your dog's AKC registration number, date of birth, and tattoo/microchip/DNA information. A microchip scanner will be on hand as well.
- Fees cover evaluations and forms only; submission of results to OFA requires additional fees payable directly to OFA. Submission of findings to Berner-Garde is encouraged.

Breeders and owners are encouraged to complete health and genetic testing available through many sources, and to record that information in the Berner-Garde database at <a href="https://www.bernergarde.org/DB/Default">https://www.bernergarde.org/DB/Default</a>. Berner-Garde will be available ringside to enter data with proper documentation.

**GenSol** will be onsite all week to offer generously discounted DNA swab tests for vWd, DM SOD1(A), and DM SOD1(B). Swabs will be sent overnight to their lab to facilitate the expedited return of test results. Home test kits will also be available at their vendor booth in the Great Hall. GenSol representatives will also be present on Wednesday and Thursday at the clinics.

#### Type 1 Von Willebrand's Disease DNA Test (GenSol): Cheek swab test kit.

Type I von Willebrand's disease in Bernese Mountain Dogs occurs as the mild form, as distinguished from the severe form, which occurs in Scottish Terriers and Shetland Sheep Dogs. It is characterized by the abnormally low production of a protein found in the blood called von Willebrand's factor which plays a key role in the complex process of clotting a damaged blood vessel.

**Degenerative Myelopathy (DM) Tests (GenSol):** Cheek swab test kits. Both the DM SOD1(A) and SOD1(B) tests are necessary to determine the risk category for your dog: Clear, Carrier, At Risk. **DM** tests for the common gene mutation found in several breeds. If you have had only one test done previously for your Berner, it is likely the test you used was SOD1(A), and it does not need to be repeated. SOD1(B) tests for the second mutation that seems to affect ONLY Bernese Mountain Dogs.

Degenerative myelopathy is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that occurs in many breeds of dog. The test being offered is based on the research done at the University of Missouri which identified mutations in the DM SOD1(A) gene. To date, the major mutation associated with this disease has been detected in 124 breeds, with a <u>second mutation</u>, SOD1(B) limited to the Bernese Mountain Dog.

# **GROOMING**

NOTE: Grooming and Crating is allowed in designated areas only. Due to LIMITED GROOMING SPACES, sharing of grooming spaces is encouraged. Remember, we're Bringing Friends Together!

LIMIT OF 2 GROOMING SPACES PER PERSON

Exhibitors may reserve a 10' x 10' grooming space for \$150, which includes one electrical plug with 20 amps of power, for the entire show period. Paid reserved spaces will be indoors on a concrete floor in the Gateway Hall or rubberized flooring with plastic sheeting provided in the Great Hall. Spaces are available on a first come, first served basis through Master Registration until capacity is reached. Exhibitors will not be allowed

to select which location (Gateway Hall/Great Hall) when reserving space; all spaces will be assigned at random based on availability. Day crating (no electric access) will be available for Obedience and Rally exhibitors.

All set-ups will be supervised by the Grounds Committee as representatives of the BMDCA. The Club reserves the right to restrict the number of grooming tables and to rearrange grooming areas and set-ups as required by circumstances for the safety and convenience of all. This includes moving crates, tables, and other equipment. Exhibitors are expected to comply with all Club rules as laid out by the BMDCA.

The Columbia MO Kennel Club is allowing select BMD Regional Clubs to host Supported Entries in conjunction with their All Breed shows on Saturday, March 30 and Sunday, March 31. Please consider entering as this will be a great opportunity to warm up for the National! Any exhibitors wishing to enter these shows MUST note their breed on the Columbia MO KC Grooming reservation. They will be putting all Bernese entrants' grooming spaces in one area of the Gateway Hall. Per Purina Farms Event Center, dogs and exhibitors MUST be out of the building by 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, March 31, no exceptions. Your equipment MAY stay in the building, but in order to allow Purina Farms employees to properly clean the building, make sure you clean up around your equipment as best as possible. For the BMDCA National, you will be required to move your belongings to your newly assigned spaces on Monday, April 1, 3:00 p.m. You will not be guaranteed the same space you had for the Columbia MO KC shows, and you will not be permitted into the grooming area earlier than 3:00 p.m. on Monday. No Exceptions! You must make separate grooming reservations for the BMDCA National Specialty, even if you have purchased a space through Columbia MO KC!

- MOVE-IN: Begins Monday, April 1 at 3:00pm
- At time of move-in, exhibitors will be required to supply contact information, including hotel, room number, and cell phone number.
- Generators and electric heaters are also prohibited. All extension cords and dryers are subject to
  inspection, and non-compliant equipment may be removed by show personnel.
